Evaluation methods used:	This conformance report is based on the results of an accessibility audit conducted by <u>The Paciello Group</u> on a representative sample of pages/components across selected user journeys, for the purpose of assessing conformance to the Web Content Accessibility Guidelines (WCAG) 2.1. The <u>W3C Website Accessibility Conformance Evaluation Methodology</u> (WCAG- EM) was followed for conducting the accessibility audit. The testing included manual accessibility testing, automated accessibility tools, and testing with assistive technology across multiple platforms and browsers. The following applications were used as part of the audit to identify potential accessibility issues: Desktop browsers: Chrome, Firefox Mobile browsers: N/A Assistive technologies: JAWS, NVDA, VoiceOver Accessibility testing tools: ARC Toolkit, Color Contrast Analyzer, Chrome Developer Tools, Firefox Developer Tools

<u>1.1.1 Non-text Content</u> (Level A)	Partially supports	 The Nuvolo web application provides text alternatives for some non-text content, with some exceptions including: CSS-generated content lacks a textual equivalent. Visual SVG and Canvas content lacks appropriate textual alternatives. Static images lack alternative text properties altogether or fail to provide adequate alternative text.

<u>1.3.1 Info and Relationships</u> (Level A)	Partially Supports	 The Nuvolo web application ensures that information, structures, and relationships are programmatically determined with some exceptions including: Error states are not programmatically conveyed in forms. Structural components such as Tables are not properly conveyed. Proper HTML semantics are not used which results in hierarchy and relationships of content not being accurately conveyed to assistive technology.



		 Content that is visually hidden is not programmatically hidden. This results in visually hidden content being exposed to assistive technology. Form inputs lack accessible names. Custom components such as Calendars, Gantt Charts, and Maps lack proper name and Role information to convey the component structures. Pages lack proper heading structure. Headings allow users to navigate pages and understand grouping and hierarchy.

<u>1.4.1 Use of Color</u> (Level A)	Partially supports	 The Nuvolo web application does not convey information through color alone, with some exceptions: Color alone is used to indicate erroneous entries in forms. Color is used to convey information in Canvas/SVG controls such as room availability.

2.1.1 Keyboard (Level A)	Partially supports	 Much of the functionality within the Nuvolo web application is operable using the keyboard, with the following exceptions: Custom functionality has been applied to the right-click function



		 Custom tooltip controls are neither focusable nor actionable using the keyboard. Tab/Tabpanel controls lack proper structural properties to expose keyboard support. Signature functionality requires users to sign their name using the mouse. No option is provided for keyboard users to digitally sign. Custom menus are not focusable using the keyboard. Custom switch inputs are used that are not focusable using the keyboard. Custom buttons are used on many pages which are not structured as standard buttons. These controls cannot be focused or activated using the keyboard. Custom components such as Calendars and the Canvas/SVG workspaces allow users to dragand-drop content using the mouse. No equivalent function to move content is provided for the keyboard. Custom Calendars, Canvas/SVG layouts, and maps include components that are actionable using the mouse but do not provide equivalent functionality using the keyboard.

2.2.1 Timing Adjustable (Level A)	Does Not Support	After a period of inactivity, the Nuvolo website ends the current session. The user is given no prior notice that their session is about to end, and there is no opportunity to extend or disable the timeout.

2.4.1 Bypass Blocks (Level A)	Partially Supports	Many pages within the Nuvolo website lack repetitive navigation sections requiring the use of Bypass Blocks. Some pages, however, include navigation structures and sidebars. These pages lack "Skip to content" links allowing users navigating with a keyboard to skip the repetitive content. Navigation may be cumbersome for users navigating using a keyboard.
2.4.2 Page Titled (Level A)	Partially Supports	 Many pages within the Nuvolo website provide page title properties that are meaningful and unique, with some exceptions: Several pages within the Nuvolo website lack meaningful and unique page titles.
2.4.3 Focus Order (Level A)	Partially supports	 The Nuvolo web application provides a logical focus order with the following exceptions: Side panel content does not properly manage focus. Focus does not properly move to the panel when opened or return when closed. Visually hidden content is focusable. Custom Gantt chart content does not properly manage focus. Dialogs, which are prevalent in the Nuvolo website, do not properly manage focus. When dialogs are opened, focus does not properly move to them and is not properly retained within them. When closing dialogs, focus does not properly return to the control that opened them.
2.4.4 Link Purpose (In Context) (Level A)	Partially Supports	Links within the Nuvolo website properly identify their purpose with one exception.



		The Portal logo image link does not adequately convey its purpose.

2.5.3 Label in Name (Level A 2.1 only)	Partially Supports	Some controls within the Nuvolo website, such as form inputs and buttons, have visual label text that is not programmatically associated with the control. This fails to convey the visual label as an accessible name. Users navigating using assistive technology cannot identify the purpose of these controls.
2.5.4 Motion Actuation (Level A 2.1 only)	Not applicable	
3.1.1 Language of Page (Level A)	Partially Supports	Some pages within the Nuvolo website properly identify the page language. This is necessary to inform assistive technology how to interpret the page. While this is properly identified in some pages, many pages within the website lack a language definition.

3.3.1 Error Identification (Level A)	Partially Supports	 The Nuvolo website provides indications of errors in forms, with the following exception: A phone number field fails to programmatically convey its error description when an error is present.



3.3.2 Labels or Instructions (Level A)	Partially Supports	 The Nuvolo website provides labels or instructions when content requires user input with some exceptions: Some fields rely on placeholder text instead of a consistently visible label.

4.1.2 Name, Role, Value (Level A)	Partially supports	 The Nuvolo web application provides the correct name, role, and state information for interactive controls, with the following exceptions: Expandable/collapsible controls do not convey their state. Form inputs lack accessible names. Interactive components such as buttons lack accessible names. Custom controls lack accessible roles. iFrame content lacks meaningful titles.

<u>1.4.4 Resize text</u> (Level AA)	Partially Supports	 The Nuvolo website supports text resizing with some exceptions: When text is resized on some pages, content becomes overlapped or is outside the viewable area.

1.4.10 Reflow (Level AA 2.1 only)	Partially Supports	 The Nuvolo website supports content reflow with some exceptions: At smaller viewport sizes, content begins to overlap or requires two-dimensional scrolling.
1.4.11 Non-text Contrast (Level AA 2.1 only)	Partially Supports	 Much of the non-text content on the Nuvolo website provides sufficient contrast, with some exceptions: Canvas/SVG content provides poor contrast between layers and boundaries.

		 Custom filter controls change color to convey their state. This change provides a low difference in contrast. Loading status images do not provide sufficient contrast.

1.4.13 Content on Hover or Focus (Level AA 2.1 only)	Partially Supports	 The Nuvolo website includes controls that provide mouse focus/hover states. Some instances of this provide keyboard fallbacks with some exceptions: Tooltips cannot be hovered over or dismissed without moving keyboard focus or the pointer to another element.
